10.7: To present the academic and other important activities & events of the institute from July 2020 to June 2021



10.12: Seeking permission for extending CCTVs surveillance system in the campus

The governing body resolved to ratify to the installation of 40 IP based 2-Line CCTV cameras in the campus. These are 2-Lines entry level smart cameras which support the features "Intrusion detection" & "Line crossing". These cameras are fixed on all approach roads and corridors of buildings. The cameras were provided at a cost of Rs.6,00,000/- (Rupees Six Lacks).

10.13: The University Grants Commission (Establishment and Operation of Academic Bank of Credits in Higher Education) Regulations' 2021.

Dr. SMV Narayana, Principal informed the Governing body that Annamacharya Institute of Technology and Sciences, Rajampet, is an autonomous institution and hence it is eligible to register for Establishment and Operation of Academic Bank of Credits in Higher Education as per the regulations 2021 under sub-regulation (2) of regulation 1 of UGC Gazette of India on 28th July 2021.

The governing body resolved to register for utilizing Academic Bank of Credits system. Further, Governing body suggested the principal to prepare modalities / framing work in line with University Grants Commission (UGC) for implementing Academic Bank of Credits in the Campus.

10.14: To consider / approval an application submitted to The commander, Andhra Engineering Company for Boys & Girls NCC Unit at Annamacharya Institute of Technology and Sciences, Rajampet.
